For the 2008-2009 school year, HomeLink is located on the North Lake Middle School campus. The school occupies 7 portable classrooms. We also utilize one science/art classroom, and two teacher office rooms in the 500 building.

HomeLink's staff is currently composed of 6 part-time certified teachers and 14 instructors, along with 1 para-educator, 1 secretary and 1 part-time administrator.

Here at HomeLink, staff and certified teachers *partner* with the parents and work as a resource to the family to enrich, expand, and promote learning. They work with both parent and student to develop individualized student learning plans (SLP), based on the child's strengths and weaknesses. Progress is assessed together each month.

High School students may enroll on either a part-time or full-time basis. Parents need to be closely involved and are required to be onsite for the first 30 days a high school student attends HomeLink. After this trial period, parents may elect to drop off their high school students, but are still responsible for student attendance, conduct, and academic progress, as well as all program communications and conferences. If these responsibilities are not fulfilled, the student will be placed on probation and the parent will be required to remain on-site during the probation period.
