JOB DESCRIPTION

POSITION: Attendance and Discipline Middle Schools,
Mid-High, and High School Attendance

REPORTS TO: Building Principals and/or Administrators

DIRECTS:

SUMMARY: Under the direction of the Building Principal and certificated School Counselors, Office Professional accurately maintains student attendance records, notifies parents of attendance issues, and coordinates Becca Bill procedures. Secretary also assists with front office duties as needed. Other similar duties as assigned.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES include the following. *Other duties may be assigned.*

- Complete all secretarial/clerical functions of the department in an efficient and timely manner.
- Enter daily attendance information in the student record database system
- Be familiar with Truancy (Becca Bill) and Compulsory Attendance
- Prepare and distribute attendance notification letters
- Telephone parent/guardian regarding attendance
- Keep building administration informed of student attendance concerns
- Respond in a warm, professional manner to all telephone callers, greet in a supportive manner all students, staff and visitors
- Process attendance notes and assignment requests
- Prepare and process attendance history/extension reports and coordinate Becca Bill procedures
- Support other attendance office functions
- Know and follow district policies and procedures
- Remain flexible and team-oriented.
- Promote and practice professional growth and development
- Work with other district personnel as required in the performance of duties and organizational needs
- Perform other duties as may be deemed necessary for the efficient operation of the department.
