

LAKE STEVENS HIGH SCHOOL TRAFFIC SAFETY TESTING POLICIES

FEES: As of September 1, 2019 the fee for students who have enrolled in and passed the Lake Stevens High School Traffic Safety program will be \$40. For students at least 18 years of age who have not successfully completed a traffic safety class or age 16 to 18 who have passed a course at another public or private driving school, the fee will be \$50.

This fee covers two (2) attempts at the knowledge test as well as two (2) attempts at the driving (skills) test. If either test is not passed after the second attempt, the full fee will be required which would pay for two (2) more attempts. This fee includes the use of a school district traffic safety education car. Only LSSD cars are used, we do not test in privately owned cars.

*** Please note that these fees are separate from the fee charged for your Traffic Safety Course and the DOL's application and licensing fees.**

REFUNDS: There will be no refunds after the first attempt at either test.

TEST SCHEDULING: Scheduling and re-tests will be conducted through the LSHS Traffic Safety coordinator, Rodger Anderson. During the school year the knowledge test is typically given on Fridays (if a school day) after school in Mr. Anderson's room at Lake Stevens High School. This usually happens about one Friday per month. During the summer or non-school days, test times can be made by appointment. Skills tests are made by appointment.

GRIEVANCES/COMPLAINTS: Any complaints will be handled by the Lake Stevens High School Traffic Safety Education program administrator, Mr. Dan Alderson.

1. The Knowledge exam consists of 40 multiple-choice questions about traffic safety laws. Applicants must answer at least 32 questions correctly to pass the exam.
2. The drive test will test the applicants' ability to drive legally and safely, including knowledge of arm signals and the ability to step on the brake pedal in a timely manner. Applicants must pass the driving test with a score of least 80%.
3. Your exam scores will be entered into the DOL database within 24 hours. You may have to visit the DOL office to apply for your license, depending on whether or not you have a picture on your permit. Passing the knowledge and drive test does not guarantee that an applicant will be issued a driver license. The Department of Licensing will determine if an applicant has met all licensing requirements. If you are under the age of 18 you must be at least 16 years old, successfully completed a traffic safety education course, have had your permit

for at least 6 months and have had 50 hours driving experience with at least 10 night driving hours to apply for your driver's license.

4. The Department of Licensing reserves the right to conduct random re-examinations; applicants refusing to take a re-examination may have their license revoked.

5. The Lake Stevens High School traffic safety program reserves the right to refuse service to anyone. At this time we are only servicing people that meet the age requirements for attending LSHS, although you do not have to be a student at LSHS or Cavelero Mid High.

6. If you received a letter from DOL to take an examination due to a physical, mental, visual or any medical issue, you must test at a DOL office. Failure to disclose this information prior to testing will result in your test not being honored at DOL to obtain your license and we will not refund the test fee.

7. If a driver has been convicted of a DUI and is required to have an Ignition Interlock Device (IID) in order to drive, they will not be allowed to test with the Lake Stevens School District.

8. At the time of the test, applicants will need to provide proof of identification such as a photo permit, out of state license, or school I.D. card.
