

**POLICIES AND RULES GOVERNING STUDENT CONDUCT AT EXTENDED
EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCES**

Attendance at any extended educational experience is a privilege. The following conduct, rules, and policies shall apply to all students attending extended educational experiences. Please carefully read the policies and rules outlined below. This form must be signed by each student and his or her parent/guardian before attending activities away from the school campus. This form will be kept on file in the school district office.

Definitions:

“Extended Educational Experience.” Covered by District Policy No. 6100, extended educational experiences held in recognition of the value of personal exposure to the multitude of learning opportunities available to school-age children in the community and the world outside of the classroom. Field trips, co-curricular activities, interscholastic athletics, and excursions are examples of extended educational experiences.

“Advisor” shall mean a district employed teacher, coach, director, and/or supervisor.

“Chaperone” shall mean an adult volunteer responsible for assisting with the supervision of students.

1. Student Rights and Responsibilities

All school rules and regulations apply to any extended educational experience regardless of its location. This includes travel to and from such experiences. Discipline for violations of the rules outlined herein and those outlined in Policies Nos. 5100.1 and 5100.2 shall be governed in accordance with Policy No. 5100: Student Rights and Responsibilities and as stated in the Lake Stevens Student Handbook.

2. Transportation

Students will be expected to travel to, during, and from activities away from the school campus in district-owned or district-authorized vehicles.

2.1 Transportation Release

Students may be released from riding in school transportation to and from extended educational experiences with prior approval based on the following:

- 2.1.1 Advisor approval. (Advisors may require school transportation as an important part of the overall activity.)
- 2.1.2 A written request for a release submitted in advance by the parent or guardian.
- 2.1.3 Approval of building administrator.

3. Curfew

Curfew times shall be established by the advisor nightly and announced to the students. Curfew time means that time in which all students are in their assigned rooms, room lights are out, activities are stopped, all telephoning has ceased, and food and beverages are not being delivered.

It is understood that in addition to regular curfew checks, advisors or chaperones may enter and search the rooms and personal belongings at any time.

4. Dress Guidelines

Some extended educational activities or sessions thereof may require special dress. Dress guidelines for the extended educational experience will be set by the advisor.

5. Personal Property

Students attending extended educational experiences will be responsible for their personal property in unsecured places. Seek advice from advisors or chaperones regarding security of vehicles, rooms, etc.

6. Dating Activities

Since extended educational experiences are an extension of the classroom and normal school activities, student conduct and behavior will be expected to be the same as it is in school. Girls and boys shall not visit each other's rooms without the knowledge and consent of the advisor.
