

DIPLOMAS FOR WORLD WAR II OR KOREAN CONFLICT VETERANS

POLICY:

The District will issue high school diplomas to World War II or Korean conflict veterans with substantial ties to the District that did not finish high school due to their military service.

To be eligible for a diploma the veteran or his/her representative must fill out the application provided by the Washington Department of Veteran Affairs and provide evidence of eligibility. The veteran must have been honorably discharged from the armed forces of the United States, scheduled to graduate from high school in the years 1940 through 1955, and left high school before graduation in order to serve in World War II or the Korean conflict.

Veterans are eligible for the diploma even if they subsequently earned a high school equivalency certificate or are deceased.

The Superintendent or his/her designee will determine those veterans who have substantial ties to the District. Examples include, but are not limited to, living or having lived in the district, having attended school in the district, having children or other descendents who have attended school in the district, and having been employed by the district or volunteering in the district.
